The 107th Annual General Meeting of the Ladies' College Old Girls' Association was held on Saturday the 8th of October 2016 at 10.30 a.m. in the Mabel Simon Hall. A tribute to Mrs Sirancee Gunawardena to commemorate her 10th death anniversary was held prior to the AGM where the Sirancee Gunawardena Memorial Scholarship Fund was launched.

Tribute to Sirancee Gunawardena

The tribute to Mrs. Gunawardena commenced with the OGA Choir singing one of Mrs Gunawardena's favourite hymns 'Great is Thy Faithfulness' under the direction of Sureka Amarasinghe. Sureka and her singers gave another moving rendition, of 'Love Changes Everything' which was made even more poignant as Mrs Gunawardena's young granddaughter, (who is currently studying in the primary school) accompanied the singers on the flute. Chitra Simithraaratchi read a passage from the Gospel of St John, Chapter 14, and a poem by David Harkins.

Shehara de Silva gave a fitting tribute to Mrs. G as she was affectionately called illustrating with anecdotes, very personal to her, but very much pertinent to the experiences of many students of the Gunawardena era. She voiced what a truly unique and wonderful person Mrs G was with her out-of-the-box thinking, understanding, tolerance and empathy for all her students, be they rebellious or compliant, inspiring a whole generation of girls to attain their full potential.

Our President, Preethi Adhietty, said that "many of us had the privilege and fortune to study under Mrs G's aegis which was indeed 'dowered with gifts beyond all praise'." She also stressed that if what we had gained at Ladies' College under Mrs. Gunawardena had any significance in our lives, we should strive our utmost to prove faithful to her vision. It was in this context that the OGA committee had decided to launch a Trust Fund in the memory of "Mrs. G", a principal who was much loved and respected due to her willingness to accept and embrace the diverse interests and talents of her students. The objective of the Fund is to assist recipient students with a monthly or annual stipend when pursuing tertiary education. The selection of students will be carried out by an elected board which will include the OGA President, President - elect and three other OGA members. She thanked Lilanthi for the first donation of Rs 500,000/- and appealed to the Old Girls to contribute towards this worthy cause. The programme concluded with the distribution of dry rations to the supporting staff in Mrs G's memory.





The 107th Annual General Meeting began with our Patroness, Mrs Eesha Speldewinde, leading the house in prayer.

President Preethi Adhihetty thanked the 250 plus Old Girls present for attending the AGM saying that the great turnout was indicative of the Old Girls' support of and cooperation in OGA activities held in the past year.

She said that one of her primary objectives in line with the constitution of the LC OGA was to foster goodwill and fellowship amongst the Old Girls and encourage a spirit of loyalty and service to the school. She felt that in the past year that she and the committee had achieved much of this objective and hoped to continue doing so through the next year with her new committee as well.

A Power Point presentation was given on the activities completed which included, to name a few, the Seniors Christmas Lunch, The Red Hot Christmas Party, Founders' Day , OGA Inter House Sports Meet, Members' Day, Spellkasters Spelling Bee and the Motivational Evening for Present Students with Kumar Sangakkara.

Preethi congratulated old girls who have made significant contributions their respective fields such as Dhara Wijetileke, Shea Weerasekera, Lakmini Wijesundera, Asha de Vos, Nayantara Fonseka and Natasha Balendra, saying that the AGM was the perfect platform to recognize and celebrate LC talent for the year 2015/16.

Preethi reported that from the time of taking over in October 2015 to date, the current Committee had made a profit of Rs 4,866,797/- (excluding the interest monies and membership fees which amounted to a further Rs. 1,195,093/-). She thanked the membership for their generous contributions and sponsorships and said that out of the profits earned, the OGA had donated Rs 2,500,000/- towards the Chapel Roof Restoration Project and that a further Rs. 1,000,000.00 was set aside for the School Motivational Fund which will be used towards motivating current students in the fields of Sports, Arts and Drama. Two large cooler boxes were donated to the school by the OGA and handed over to the Principal.

She informed the house that Dr Deepthi Attgalle, the manager of the school, was retiring at the end of the year, she thanked her for the support and guidance given to both the school and the OGA. She said that Dr Attygalle's commitment and passion for the school has been a source of strength to all of us and her presence will be missed immensely.

Preethi also thanked her committee, members many of whom had served their term in office, for their support and hard work. She concluded her speech by quoting Le Baron Russel Briggs who said "As has often been said, the youth who loves his Alma Mater will always ask, not 'What can

she do for me?' but 'What can I do for her?' and said that in the spirit of "one family unbroken", we must constantly question ourselves as to what we can do in our individual ways. bringing our talents, skills, contacts, time and efforts to develop and propelling us to be among the best educational institution in the world.

Our Patroness and Principal, Mrs Speldewinde, in addition to the school report (refer attachment) was pleased to announce that the students had achieved excellent results in the local and London examinations. She said that universities from around the world were offering our students scholarships and assistance to pursue higher studies and emphasized the importance of teachers and teacher training and said that she has started a collaborative teacher training programme. She was also hosting a programme for parents in collaboration with Natasha Balendra of NCPA and Hans Billimoria. She thanked the Old Girls for their support and said that she had been blessed with two wonderful OGA Presidents since she took over as Principal of the school.

The following resolutions proposed by Dr Deepthi Attygalle were unanimously passed.

The Constitution of the Ladies' College Old Girls' Association be amended by the repeal of paragraph (1) of Article 5 and the substitution of the following new paragraph (1), therefor –

Subscriptions 5 (1) The subscription payable by a Member, "Life Member and Associate Member" to the Association shall be as determined by the Executive Committee. "

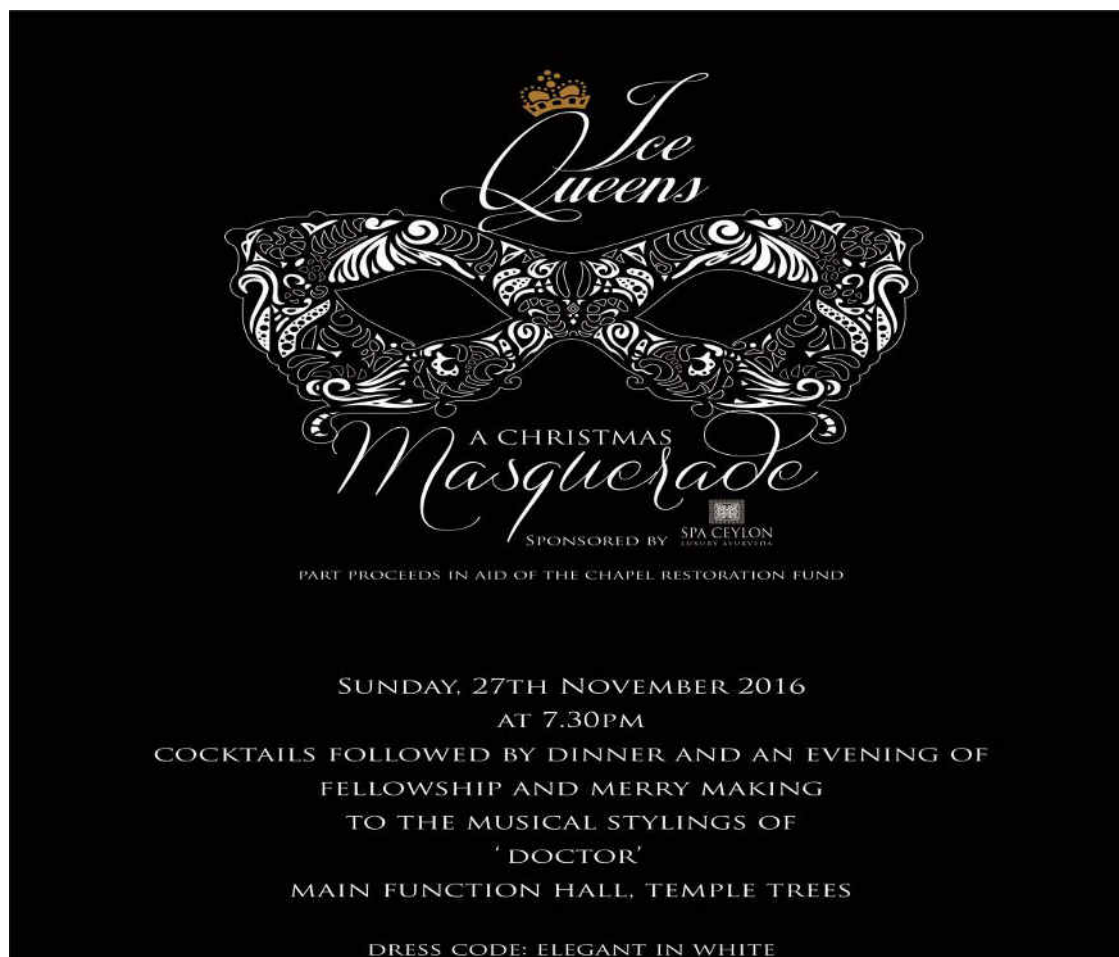
The second sentence in Clause 25 be amended as follows —

Such member shall serve as the Association's representative on the Governing Body for a period of three years and shall be eligible to be nominated to serve on the Governing Body for a further period of three years.
