It was a charming gesture by the committee of the Ladies' College OGA to hold a "A Christmas Serenade Magical Christmas Evening for Elders." Ninety senior members of the OGA and a sprinkling of retired teachers, met on November 24 in the spacious dining hall of the school hostel for a well-planned evening of fun, fellowship and dinner. All were over 70, but more of us were well-above the biblical span of 3 score years and ten and we smiled at one another as we held on to our walking sticks and were guided to our tables by a welcoming committee of comparative youngsters who placed a bracelet of jasmines round our wrists as they greeted us. The fragrance of those jasmines seemed to permeate the room throughout the whole happy evening.

Oldsters don't often get about much, so this opportunity to catch up with friends from kindergarten days and talk of shared memories of times past in surroundings that were full of nostalgia for us, was a blessed event. A game called "Musical Lotto" was played before savory "bites" were brought to our tables together with glasses of milk wine that ushered in the festive mood. The more ambulatory among us moved around to chat with friends at other tables until we were all riveted to our seats to watch a fine exhibition of ballroom dancing given by a young man named Dilan (who holds classes attended by many Old Girls), partnered by an equally expert former student of his, one of our younger members.

Dinner was then served and it was a sumptuous, Western-style Christmas feast specially cooked by Old Girls whose culinary gifts were well-known. All those who waited on us that evening were attired in red blouses and had on their heads the typical Christmas-elf kind of red cap trimmed with white (our school colors), with a loop that ended in a white pompom. The table cloths and serviettes were also in red and white. The "cooks" wore attractive aprons as well. A tantalizing fresh mushroom soup whetted our appetites and the menu that followed lived up to the promise of the soup. For dessert, we had Delia's Christmas Pudding with brandy cream and some melting marzipans were served at the end.

"O Holy Night" was sung solo by a second generation "Old Girl" whose glorious voice held us spellbound and the beauty of that loved carol, as she sang it, will stay with us for a long time. A sing-along was on the program and we each received a neat little booklet containing the words of old songs and of carols, bound in red and white, to take away with us as a memento. We sang with happy gusto, even if not all our voices were at concert pitch. Finally, we sat for group photographs according to our ages those who were 70 to 75, 80 to 85 and 85 to 90.

All of us would unanimously join in a sincere Vote of Thanks to the OGA Committee, and particularly to those who worked so hard to see that everything went perfectly. It was indeed a memorable "Magical Christmas Evening" that we Seniors will not forget.
